PROCESS + PASSION

Was there a pivotal moment that led you to the world of design? After spending 20 years supporting a professional athlete’s career, I returned to design in my 40s. It wasn’t the most traditional path, but it felt deeply right. I gained valuable insights into construction while project managing for a boutique custom builder, and that experience changed everything. It gave me the confidence to launch my own firm with solid skills and a strong foundation.

Who has been your greatest creative influence? My mom, Marcy, who was a designer in Park City for many years. She encouraged me to take the leap. My mom believed in me before I fully believed in myself. She still helps on installs and talks through challenges with me when projects get tough.

Where do you find creative inspiration? I’m constantly inspired by architecture rooted in place. Firms that honor the land, materiality and craftsmanship resonate most with me. I’m drawn to restraint, warmth and spaces that feel timeless rather than trendy.
